Bayswater also had several players selected into State Teams (even though and due to COVID-19, several planned championships were cancelled).

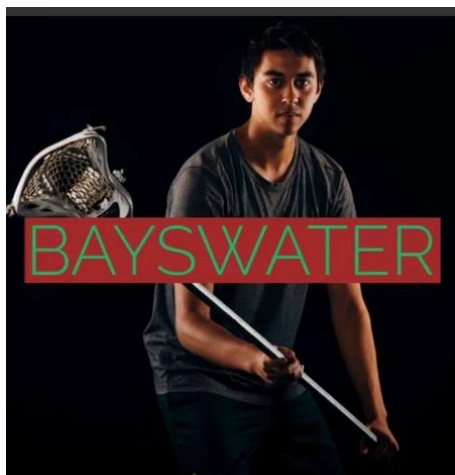

BLC COMMITTEE MAIN ACHIEVEMENTS 2020

- The MODCROSSE programme started in April at Halliday Park with around 80 children along with many parents. There was a whole team of coaches, people on the BBQ, promotion at schools and all sponsored by Niche Timber Flooring. It was amazing and a great success until COVID-19 came along.
- The committee spent considerable time analysing costings as to participate in the proposed 2020 season or by-pass until 2021. The main consideration was that the committee did not want to leave the club in a poor financial position but did everything possible to get players back on the park. Therefore, the focus was on being careful looking for opportunities to save money & maybe even frugal?
- Many hours were taken up planning and executing COVID-19 requirements, including getting our bar and canteen back up and running providing profits for the club.
- Worked very diligently in getting sponsors in this awkward and shortened season. Results were excellent and support from our long-term supporters was exceptional. A new liquor sponsor was also obtained for the next three years commencing March 2021.
Sponsors are critical to our club and we encourage members to use them whenever possible. They are:
Loan Market, Ray White Whiteman & Associates. Moneycare Solutions, CH Signs, Perth Stairs, Niche Timber Flooring & Bottlemart Stirling Cellars.
- The committee worked on a Code of Conduct including Social Media which has now been implemented and in place so there is better understanding of what is required to be a member of BLC.
- BLC is one of only two clubs to get an MPIO (Member Protection Officer), in place. We were very fortunate Todd Keen put up his hand and volunteered. He has completed the on-line and class training and is now fully qualified and ready if needed.
- On the same note, we, with Todd's help created a 45-page MPIO club BY-LAW. This is available for members to read + a copy is on the bar for all to see.
- We up-dated all club by-laws (some hadn't been changed since the 1990's). We also wrote 5 new by-laws (including Working With Children, Payments to club umpires, Ground management on training nights, Fairest & Best Voting and of course MPIO. Copies are available to all members and a copy is also on the bar for all to read.
- Negotiated a lease VARIATION with the City of Bayswater, where the COB will pay all electricity & gas costs plus no fees to the club for rates giving the club a considerable saving for the next five years. This variation is without any compromise to the existing lease which has a term of seven years left to run with a five-year extension option.
- Obtained a grant of \$500 for juniors from the Dept of Sport & Rec, a one off COVID-19 payment of \$500 from our new liquor sponsor, a \$2,000 credit from Synergy and a fee credit for the Bar License.
- Every member of our club that helped with juniors, was required to get a Working With Children clearance which was controlled, verified and tracked within the club to ensure compliance with our BY-LAW. This included all Coaches, assistant coaches, team managers and all committee members.
- Juniors – well what an outstanding 2020 season for our junior teams (boys and girls). As a committee we are not in any way claiming credit but what we want for the future is to get the junior's parents more involved and as a big part of our future moving forward. Our juniors are our future!

Please note that the position of Club Manager was initially held by Margaret Morley who stood aside from the position in February 2020 for personal reasons.

The committee would like to acknowledge and thank Margaret for the outstanding effort and work that she committed to this position prior to stepping aside.

I took over the position of Club Manager for the club following Margaret stepping aside. I was approached to fill this position due to the fact that at that time, mid-February, the season was approaching fast, and the committee needed a person that had previous experience as a committee member and in particular as Club Manager. In short this needed a person that understood both how the club and the association ran and could step in immediately. The intent being to find another person to undertake the role as the season progressed.

Unfortunately, within weeks of my taking up the position we were facing the reality of the COVID-19 Pandemic and the impact that this was imposing upon sporting clubs such as ours.

This included the club receiving an enormous amount of information from various groups that included:

- The City of Bayswater (CoB).
- Lacrosse WA (LWA).
- Department of Local Government Sport and Cultural Industries.
- Health Department of WA.
- Australian Hotel Association (AHA).

The information provided from the organisations was extensive and was being updated constantly. The requirements to be met were both onerous and at times conflicting. Compliance was however, strictly required and failure to do so had very serious ramifications. There was also a significant commitment from the committee to ensure that we as a minimum we met, if not exceeded these requirements, so that we were providing a safe and healthy environment and not exposing any club members to health risks.

This did mean that at times we may have erred on the side of caution to ensure that we complied with the requirements of each organisation that was providing information.

The work that was required to be undertaken to determine if we would be able to field teams, in which grades these could be fielded, the financial risk to the club and the policy and procedures required to be implemented to even allow training to recommence was extremely intense and very time consuming.

I understand from the feedback that I and other members of the committee received in person, through Facebook and other chat groups that there was much frustration from club members. This at times did result in personal criticism from some club members and other persons that had been but were no longer club members.

Please be assured however that this committee was doing all in its power to look after and protect the best interest of the club and the health and wellbeing of the club members at all times.

Such was the impact of the COVID-19 issue, I would say that this imposed the greatest workload and most stressful period that I have endured as a member of a BLC Committee over 10 of the last 12 years, and trust that now members can appreciate the most difficult position that the committee was in.

With this said we did get a season up and running and fielded teams to all grades, this in itself was a great success and an endorsement of the huge effort that was put in by this Committee and a core group of dedicated volunteers.

While we had varying degrees of on-field success it was great to see the enthusiasm of our junior teams and their high level of success they did achieve. The playing future looks bright.
